Program: Leslie Grow is a Naturalist for the Indiana Department of Natural Resources at Hardy Lake State Park. She has served our community working with DNR for twenty years.

The Dwight Chamberlain Raptor Center is increasing in the number of raptors it houses. Under the leadership of Matt Taylor, they enjoy the heaviest staffing at the Center since it opened. The work they do at the Raptor Center doesn't help just the birds, but people as well. Ninety percent of the raptors they assist are there due to some kind of interaction with humans. They recently treated a barn owl, on the endangered species list, for gunshot wounds from Howard County. As she recovered, they rescued a clutch of young barn owls. A young male in the clutch was paired with the recovering female and have now been released in Scott County to a barn with an owl box. Barn owls will nest three times a year. They are hopeful for this pair. Last year they treated the youngest screech owls ever after recovering them from a tree that had been cut down. All the raptors create opportunities for education for the community.

DNR is increasing educational activities for kids through Outreach Programs. One is the Explorer Program. The kids receive a list of all the state parks and special programs or unique things at that park. They then visit all Indiana State Parks and participate in the activities on the list. They can volunteer at the activity and report on what they found interesting. They may go on a hike or do something unique in that particular state park. They earn pins for completion that can be attached to a poster with all the 33 locations in the state. They also have an Indiana Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights with outdoor activities kids can do. Once completed they can print an Outdoor Kids Certificate on the IN DNR website to acknowledge what they've accomplished. They offer internship programs for college students to do hands on work in the parks. You must be 18 to do the hands on work. Over 46,000 people participated in educational programs with the Indiana State Parks and DNR last year.

The Kiwanis thanked Leslie for her presentation and update on what's going on at the Raptor Center and new programs at the Indiana State Parks.
